

The Flint Registry was developed for anyone who was exposed to lead-contaminated water in the City of Flint because they lived, worked, attended school or received child care in Flint between April 2014-October 2015.

- **What does it do?** The Flint Registry helps connect people who were impacted by the Flint Water Crisis to services and programs to aid in the recovery process, monitor child development, and promote health and overall wellness.
- **How much does it cost?** The Flint Registry is **free** and **voluntary**.
- > Is it just for kids? No, The Flint Registry is for all ages.
- **Why would I join?** To get connected to the big picture so your experience is part of the story, to be supported by resources, and to ensure that your voice is counted.
- > What happens if I join? If you join, you will complete a survey about your exposure to the Flint Water Crisis, your health concerns and background. If you choose to, you will then be connected to services that you are potentially eligible for that you are not connected to.
- **What happens if I change my mind?** You can choose to not answer any question, or to stop participating at any time.
